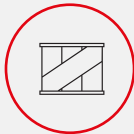

Client Case Study

COMPANY: Educational College

LOCATION: Dublin, Ireland

WHAT WAS INVOLVED:

For this college refurbishment project, the Archbishops Archive, comprising around 10,000 boxes, needed relocation between two campus libraries. The sequential packing of archive boxes from storage, transfer via a custom wooden ramp system from the 1st Floor to Ground Floor, and subsequent unpacking on new shelves were key steps.

Given the historical significance, a meticulous shelf mirroring approach was employed, mapping the current shelf to the new system, and creating corresponding

labels. Overcoming challenges, such as the lack of a lift on the first floor, involved constructing a custom ramp system on the stairwell.

The outcome was a successful and timely relocation of the entire archive, including additional materials, to the new library, facilitating the building's redevelopment.
